Fve times Chile's Winery of the Year. Pablo Morandé was also named a 'Winemaking Legend' by MW Tim Atkin in 2017, His winemaker is Jorge Martinez, who has worked at cellars worldwide, including Napa's Kendall Jackson and Pauillac's Léoville Poyferré. Carignan from 40-year-old vines in the warm Maule valley, this is a velvety, dark, spiced red. An ideal match with lamb shanks.

Vina Falernia "Alta Tierra" Sauvignon Blanc Elqui Valley Chile 2023



From an extraordinary region in the north of Chile next to the Atacama desert. Thanks to snowmelt from the Andes and the wonders of irrigation, green and flourishing vineyards stand out in contrast to their lunar-like surroundings. This dazzling Sauvignon Blanc displays classic varietal character of elderflower and freshly mown grass with ripe melon and citrus fruit. Enjoy on its own or partner with spicy Asian dishes or fish.

This is a special Cabernet, the grapes sourced from vineyards in the high altitude La Consulta subregion of the Uco Valley. Temperatures are cool, so ripening is particularly slow. This explains the elegance, depth and lovely aromatics of this red, while ageing in part new, French oak barrels lends real finesse. To enjoy now, open early and decant. It'll age well too

Alma Andina Torrontes Mendoza Argentina 2023



Alma Andina is made for us by Rodolfo Sadler – aka the talent behind bestselling Opi Malbec. This thrilling Torrontés has wonderfully fresh aromas of honeysuckle, spice and citrus fruits, and an exhilarating, crisp finish. It's a refreshingly different apéritif and an inspired choice with spicy Eastern cuisine.

a blend of Carmenère (50%), with equal portions of Syrah and Petit Verdot – planted on the lower mountain, granite slopes. 18 months in fine, part-new Seguin Moreau oak barrels adds superb complexity. At 15%, it's a big wine that'll benefit from opening early and decanting, or cellaring. A fine red, ideal with steak or a rich casserole.
