

The Society's Bordeaux Sauvignon 2024 £9.95

This is pure Bordeaux sauvignon made without the use of oak in a crisp and fruity modern style that allows its fruit to shine. It is blended from a range of sources according to the vintage to achieve a consistent level of complexity. The label carries an image of a great Bordeaux landmark, the Pont de Pierre bridge that crosses the River Garonne in the heart of the city.

The Society's Verdicchio Classico 2024 £8.95

One of Italy's best buys, Verdicchio makes vibrant, crisp and refreshing wines. This is from a beautiful and organic single vineyard and has a full, dry style, with grapefruit, lemon and mineral notes that slip down easily with or without food.

The Society's Australian Chardonnay 2024 £7.75

Made exclusively by Yalumba, this is a modern, unoaked Australian chardonnay at a very good-value price. Crisp, citrus-led and light on the palate, it makes for enjoyable, unpretentious refreshment. Yalumba's environmental credentials are impeccable. They are 100% accredited by Sustainable Winegrowing Australia and a Silver Member of International Wineries for Climate Action (IWCA). They harvest solar energy at their winery, the largest in Australia at the time it was installed in 2016.

Minervois, Plaisir d'Eulalie, Château Sainte Eulalie 2024 £11.50

Generous, ripe and full-flavoured Languedoc red, ripe and fruity, round and plummy in a vintage where very low yields concentrated flavours in the juice. Château Sainte Eulalie is an outstanding 34-hectare estate spread over the Aude Valley, on the south side of the Montagne Noire. Since 1996 it has been run by Laurent and Isabelle Coustal who are responsible for its excellent reputation.

Pinot Noir, Ostoros 2024 £8.75

Value-for-money Hungarian pinot noir that displays bright red-berry, cherry and violet aromas, all deliciously accessible and juicy.

Ferdinand Mayr Exclusiv Blaufränkisch 2024 £9.50

Blaufränkisch is one of Austria's most exciting red grape varieties, known for its vibrant fruit, bright acidity, and gentle spice. While some examples lean towards a more structured, age-worthy style, this example is all about pure, juicy drinkability, showcasing how approachable and effortless Austrian reds can be when made in a lighter, fruit-driven style.
